**Scope and Content:** E.P. Leonard was employed at the Ohio Works of U.S. Steel Corp. in the forty-three inch rolling mill, as first assistant roller on the twenty-three inch roll crew. He was a member of the team responsible for the preparation and presentation of a training class for the twenty-three inch roll crews in 1969. The materials in this collection relate to that training course and the rolling mill, including the course manual, operators' notebooks, diagrams and department schedules.

**Provenance:** The Ohio Historical Society acquired the E.P. Leonard Papers in August, 1995, through donation by his son, Patrick Leonard. Martha Bishop processed the collection in July, 1998.
