## RULES OF THE STATE LIBRARY.

---

### HOURS.

The Ohio State Library is open every day, except Sunday and the usual holidays.

During the session of the Legislature, from 9 o'clock A.M. till 12 M.; from 2 P.M. to 5 P.M.; and from 7 P.M. to 9 P.M.

After the adjournment of the Legislature, from 9 A.M. till 12 M., and from 2 to 5 P.M.

### REGULATIONS.

All persons are permitted to visit the Library and examine and read the books and magazines.

Those who are entitled to take out books are—

*By law :*

- Members and officers and ex-members of the Legislature;
- State officers and clerks in the several departments;
- The Judges of the Supreme Court and Courts of Common Pleas;
- Superintendents in the benevolent and other State institutions.

*By resolution :*

Resident ministers in the city of Columbus have, by a resolution of the General Assembly, free use of the Library, in accordance with the rules, who are at the time pastors of congregations, and who apply in person for books for their own special use.

The privilege of drawing books from the Library is also extended to the officers and teachers in the benevolent institutions of the State; officers and teachers of the Ohio Agricultural College; officers of the Ohio Penitentiary; ex-officers of the State; ex-officers of the General Assembly, and to the widows of deceased ex-members of the General Assembly and ex-State officers.

### RESTRICTIONS.

Not more than two books can be taken by any person at one time within two weeks.

Books must be returned within two weeks.

Books of reference, and other books of peculiar value, are kept from circulation.

A public officer, or any other person having a right to take out books, who gives any other individual an order for books to be used by another not having such right, forfeits his own right to draw books.

Books lost or damaged must be replaced or paid for.

Copying from Library books must be done with pencil.

Loud talking forbidden.

Smoking prohibited.





## PREFACE.

---

*To the General Assembly of Ohio:*

The cataloguing of the large number of books, pamphlets, papers, etc., comprised in the Ohio State Library, which was entered upon by Mr. William Holden, who was materially aided in the arduous labor by Miss M. C. Harbaugh, Assistant Librarian, was commenced on the 27th of May, 1874, and completed and placed in the hands of the printers on the first of September last.

The last Legislature authorized one thousand volumes of the work to be printed, which has been executed with dispatch by Nevins & Myers, the public printers, and in a style of typography that is highly commendable. The binding also, executed by the inmates of the Asylum for the Deaf and Dumb, under the direction of Mr. M. C. Lilley, Superintendent of the bindery, and of Mr. C. B. Flood, Supervisor of Public Printing, is a feature deserving of special notice. As to the character of the new catalogue—its order of arrangement, its simplicity and completeness—it is all expressed in a liberal criticism by the editor of the State Journal, in the issue of December 28, from which this extract is made:

“The plan of this catalogue is the simplest and the most concise, yet complete, that we are acquainted with. Each work is entered under *author*, *title*, and *subject*, the whole being arranged in a single alphabetical series. The inquirer need only know his author's name to be able to turn instantly to the name of the book he requires, if it is in the library. If the name of the author has escaped him, he may turn to the title of the work. If he has forgotten that, he may consult the index for the general subject of his investigation, and find both the author and the title of his book, and also those of all other writers on the subject whose works appear on the shelves of our State Library. Nor is this all. In the same place with the author's name, the title of his book, and the subject of its contents, he will find the precise case in the library where the book is to be found, and the very shelf of the library on which it belongs. So that any absolute stranger, with nothing more than the general knowledge of the arrangement of the cases, may go into the library, and with this book in his hand may, in one minute, find any one of the volumes on its shelves.

It seem to us one could not reasonably require more than this in any catalogue. The mechanical department is worthy of praise. The execution is much superior to that of the ordinary run of State work. The paper is excellent, the types are exceedingly clear, the work is remarkably free from annoying typographical errors, and the binding of the copy before us is superb.”

We deem it proper, in this connection, to call the attention of the Legislature to the fact that this new catalogue, as the compiler sets forth, does *not* include the six thousand and odd volumes that comprise the Law Library. While the labor of cataloguing was progressing, the question of including the books of the Law Library in this catalogue was raised, and was referred to Attorney-General Little, who responded on the 18th August, in a letter to this board, that "by the act of February 16, 1867 (S. & S., page 250), the Law Library is recognized as a separate and distinct department from the State Library, and is not therefore under your control." Exclusive, therefore, of the volumes comprised in the Law Library, that of the State numbers at this time, with what are specified in the new catalogue, and what have been added since its publication, thirty-five thousand volumes or works.

The number of catalogues printed being larger than the needs of the Library require to be retained, it is suggested to members of the Assembly whether it would not be judicious for some action to direct the manner and conditions by which the surplus copies might be disposed of, and if sold, what shall be the price and disposition of the proceeds. The total cost of the one thousand volumes is here set forth as a basis of such action: For paper, \$1,040; printing, \$1,518.66; cataloguing, \$2,000; binding, \$1,150. This latter item is an estimate of the manager of the bindery, who calculated the average cost of the several qualities of the work at \$1.15 per volume. Total cost, \$5,708.66.

The last Legislature, conceding that the facilities for light in the Library room were greatly defective, and that a material enlargement was essential, made an appropriation at its last session of \$3,309.77 for that purpose, and authorized the work to be done by contract. Proposals were issued on the ninth day of June, and publication made in accordance with special statute, based on the plans, specifications, and estimates of Tinsley and Cook, the architects and superintendents. Their estimate of the total cost of the work, when completed, was put at \$3,300. After the close of the advertised period, it was found by the board that but one bid was offered for the work, that of J. Gill Blain, with M. C. Blain, Windsor Atcheson, and John T. Blain as bondsmen. This proposal, with the names of the sureties, being referred to Attorney-General Little, he gave it his official approval, and the contract was closed. The obligation of the contractor was, in brief, for the sum of \$2,950 to complete the work according to the specifications, "to the satisfaction of the said Commissioners, on or before the first day of November, 1875," and bore date of July 30, 1875. In the event of the failure to complete it by the time specified, the contractor is obligated "to forfeit and pay to the



State of Ohio the sum of ten dollars per day for each and every day thereafter until all such work is finished and completed." About six weeks after the contract was ratified, the entire interior of the main Library, from floor to ceiling, was given up to the demands of the contractor, who proceeded to erect an elaborate scaffolding, which practically closed the Library from public access and use, and which still holds possession.

During all this long interval, no progress of the work was made. When November 1st came, the day of its obligated completion, nothing had been done, although, on the authority of the board, the architect had by verbal and written admonitions urged it forward. It was not till the first day of December inst. that the workmen entered to begin a job that was to have been completed a full month before. With this simple statement of the case, as an explanation of the unpleasant condition of this important department of the State House, on the assembling of the Legislature, we must leave the matter to such future action as may be deemed expedient and proper. It is unfortunate that the work fell into such unreliable hands, as they have proven to be, but the board had no other alternative available at the time, and the result is as we have herein disclosed.
