## OHIO STATE LIBRARY RULES AND RESTRICTIONS.

### HOURS.

The Ohio State Library is open every day, except Sunday and the usual holidays.

During the session of the Legislature, from nine o'clock A.M. till twelve M.; from two P.M. to five P.M.; and from seven P.M. to nine P.M.

After the adjournment of the Legislature, from nine A.M. till twelve M., and from two to five P.M.

### REGULATIONS.

All persons are permitted to visit the Library and examine and read the books and magazines.

Those who are entitled to take out books are—

*By law :*

Members and officers and ex-members of the Legislature ;  
State officers and clerks in the several departments ;  
The Judges of the Supreme Court and Courts of Common Pleas ;  
Superintendents in the benevolent and other State institutions.

*By resolution :*

Resident ministers in the city of Columbus have, by a resolution of the General Assembly, free use of the Library, in accordance with the rules, who are at the time pastors of congregations, and who apply in person for books for their own special use.

The privilege of drawing books from the Library is also extended to the officers and teachers in the benevolent institutions of the State ; officers and teachers of the Ohio Agricultural College ; officers of the Ohio Penitentiary ; ex-officers of the State ; ex-officers of the General Assembly, and to the widows of deceased ex-members of the General Assembly and ex-State officers.

### RESTRICTIONS.

1. Not more than two books can be taken from the Library by the same person at the same time, and no additional books must be taken out until they are returned.

2. All books taken from the Library must be returned within two weeks, and the same books can not be taken out again by the same party until the expiration of two days thereafter.

3. All books of reference, and others of rare and peculiar value, are not intended for circulation, but must be consulted in the Library.

4. Valuable illustrated works must not be taken out, used, nor handled for mere amusement.

5. No person is allowed to take any book from the alcove, nor from the *tables*, without permission, and no book can be taken from the Library without a memorandum thereof upon the record by the Librarian or Assistant.

6. Any person returning books to the Library must report the same to the Librarian or Assistant, who will cancel them upon the record.

7. All persons who lose, or permit books to be damaged while in their possession, must pay for or replace them.

8. All copying from books in the Library must be done with pencil; leaves must not be turned down, and no marks of any kind made on the margins.

9. Any person having the legal right to take books from the Library, who shall give an order for, or furnish books to any other person not having such right, to be used by such other person, shall thereby forfeit his or her own privileges.

10. Members and officers of the General Assembly shall return all books in their possession four days before the adjournment of the session; and it shall be the duty of the Librarian to report to the Senate or House of Representatives, the names of any officers or members who shall fail to comply with the foregoing requirement.

11. Loud talking and smoking strictly forbidden.



## LIBRARY COMMISSIONERS' REPORT.

1879.

*To the General Assembly of Ohio :*

Pursuant to the requirements of law, we have the honor to submit the following report of this department of the public service.

### FINANCES.

The statement of the expenses of the Library during the year will be found in the exhibit herewith annexed. Owing to a decrease in the appropriation by the last General Assembly for the purchase of books, our additions are less than for several years previous. The inter-State and miscellaneous exchanges have been continued during the year. Twelve hundred and twenty-five volumes, bound and unbound, have been sent to State libraries, societies, and individuals who reciprocate.

Fifty-three periodicals have been bound. In respect to this class of reading, this Library will compare favorably with those of other States.

An appended list comprises the daily and weekly newspapers contributed during the year, for which courtesy the commissioners desire to express their acknowledgment. These papers are kept on file for reference only, and when bound are included in the general catalogue.

### PRESENT CONDITION AND NEEDS OF THE LIBRARY.

It is an admitted fact by all who are familiar with the books upon our shelves, that there is not a State Library in the Union—when the number of volumes is taken into consideration—which surpasses it in genuine worth and merit.

It is indeed a centrally located reservoir of knowledge, to which persons of every profession and from all parts of the State apply for information which they can derive from no other source. In the purchase of books during the past year care has been taken not to lower this standard of excellence by a large addition of light literature, which may

interest the mind of the reader for the moment, and then pass away as dew before the morning sun, but works mainly for reference and consultation, and these of the best possible character.

It is earnestly hoped that your honorable body may be liberal in your appropriation for the purchase of books. Ohio, the third State in the Union in point of population and wealth, but first in her benevolent institutions and common schools, can not—and, we are very sure, will not—permit her Library to fall into disrepute for want of sufficient appropriations from year to year. The amount requested is small when compared with allowances made by other States for the same purpose.

At its last session the Legislature appropriated \$300.00 to re-shelve and make other much needed repairs in the newspaper room; but when the estimated cost of these repairs was furnished us, we found the sum insufficient by \$200.00, which additional amount we hope you will grant us. The work has not been done, we preferring to trust your liberality for the balance needed, rather than contracting a debt. In its present state the shelving is not only disgraceful in appearance and unsafe, but also inadequate for the proper position of the bound volumes of newspapers which are almost in daily use.

An additional expense of eighty dollars, as reported to the State Auditor, arose from a necessary change in the chandeliers. For the past two winters the light has been so insufficient as to render the room almost useless to readers during the evening. To remedy this a change of globes was made, producing the desired result. In this connection, it is respectfully suggested that the members of the General Assembly make a personal acquaintance with the Library, where books, entertaining and instructive, may be found and enjoyed amid pleasant and quiet surroundings.

Attention is invited to the rules and restrictions of the Library, an observance of which is necessary to insure success in the administration of the department.

All volumes received have been properly classified and catalogued on cards, similar to the published index of 1875. This work of indexing has become a necessary feature of library management, and has been voluntarily performed for four years past by Miss Mary C. Harbaugh, Assistant Librarian. Many libraries make it the special duty of one person, having a separate appropriation for the same.

The room is one of the most attractive in the Capitol, and, being accessible to the public, is visited by thousands of persons annually, all of whom speak approvingly of its inviting appearance.



In conclusion, it is earnestly hoped the foregoing concise statement of the condition of the Library may prove of interest, and that our request for needed appropriations may meet with a favorable response. All of which is respectfully submitted.
