RULES OF THE STATE LIBRARY.

HOURS.

The Ohio State Library is open every day, except Sunday, and the usual holidays.

During the session of the Legislature, from 9 o'clock A. M. till 12 M.; from 2 to 5 P. M., and from 7 to 9 P. M.

After the adjournment of the Legislature, from 9 A. M. till 12 M., and from 2 to 5 P. M.

REGULATIONS.

All persons are permitted to visit the Library, and examine and read the books and magazines.

Those who are entitled to take out books, are—

By Law :

Members and officers, and ex-Members of the Legislature.

State Officers and Clerks in the several Departments.

The Judges of the Supreme Court and Courts of Common Pleas.

Superintendents of the Benevolent and other State Institutions.

By Resolution :

Resident ministers of the city of Columbus have, by a resolution of the General Assembly, free use of the Library, in accordance with the rules, who are at the time Pastors of congregations, and who apply in person for books for their own especial use.

RESTRICTIONS.

Not more than two books can be taken by any person at one time, within two weeks.

Books must be returned within two weeks.

Books of reference, and other books of peculiar value, are kept from circulation.

A public officer, or any other person having a right to take out books, who gives any other individual an order for books, or who obtains books to be used by another not having such right, thereupon forfeits his own right to draw books.

Books lost or damaged must be replaced or paid for.

Copying from Library books must be done with a pencil.

Loud talking forbidden.

Smoking prohibited.

To the General Assembly of Ohio :

The additions to the Library for the year now reported have been very much larger than at any former period, numbering nearly two thousand volumes, over two-thirds by purchase, the balance by donation and exchange.

The Librarian is giving attention to complete such an arrangement of the St. Clair Papers as will make them accessible for use, without being easily disarranged, which he hopes will be ready by the time the Legislature meets.

We would again refer to the necessity of appropriating a sum sufficient to finish the second and third stories of the Library room with alcoves and upper shelving. There is no more space for books as they are purchased or sent us. Some now on hand, and not frequently called for, have to be removed to make room for new books more in demand, or of more value. We urge it as indispensable, and hope your early attention will be given to this subject, that arrangements for doing the work may be made, so as to have it completed before the close of the year 1872.

During the past year a collection of manuscripts has been made which, it is believed, with proper attention, can be increased so as to become a very interesting and valuable department of the Library. A catalogue of the collection will be found in the Librarian's report.

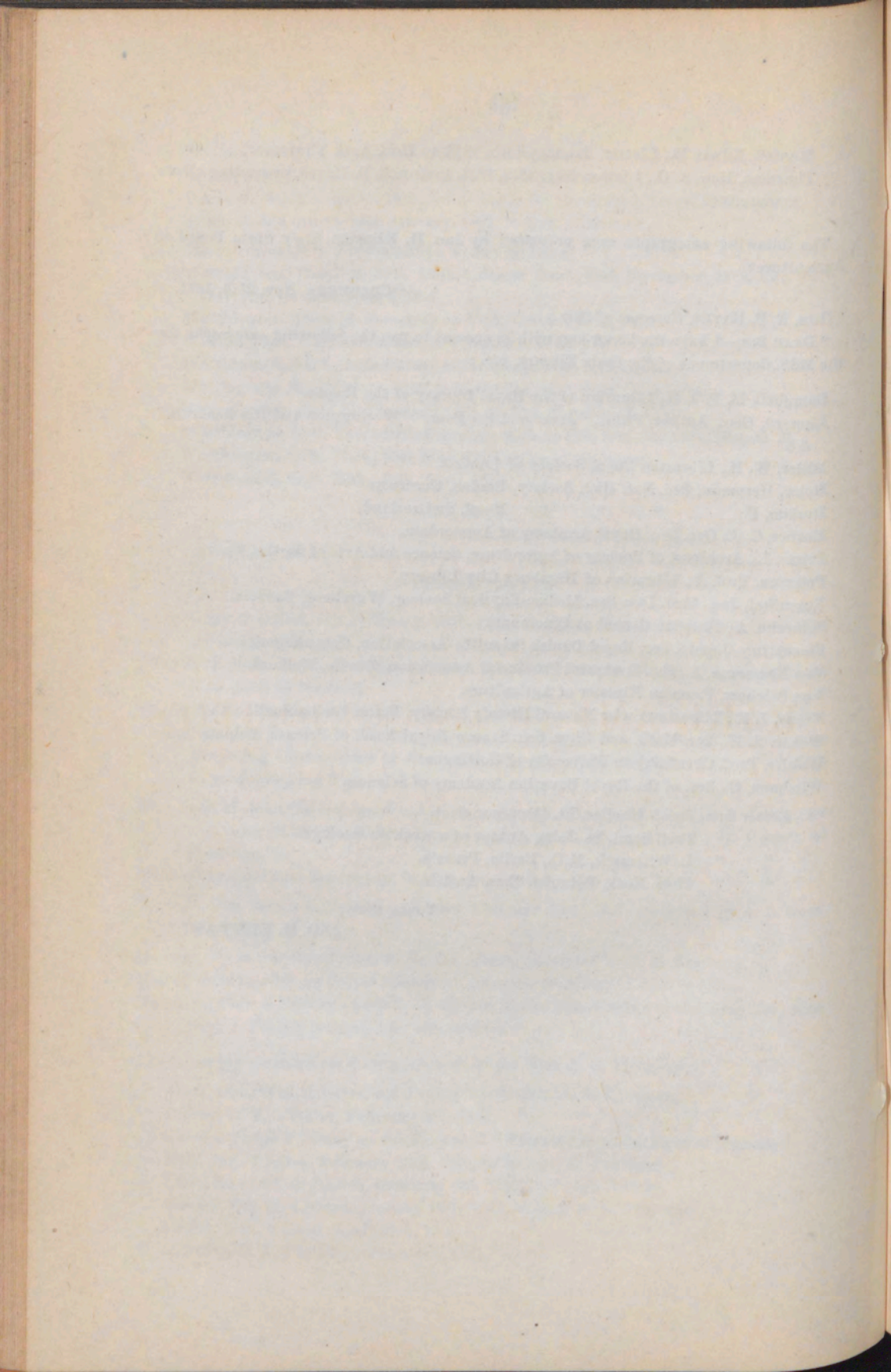

ARTHUR ST. CLAIR PAPERS.

At the session of the Legislature of 1870, a resolution was passed, "To purchase, for the use of the State Library, the correspondence, messages, documents and manuscripts generally of Arthur St. Clair, Governor of the North-west Territory for fourteen years, from 1788 to 1802; to be expended at the discretion of the Governor and State Librarian, a sum sufficient for that purpose not exceeding two thousand dollars."

The papers were purchased for two thousand dollars, and are now deposited in the library. / They have been classified and arranged as well as time would permit, and have as a guide to the entire lot, the following indexes:

INDEX No. 1 is to copies of letters written *by* Arthur St. Clair—No. 1 to 207—with the dates in order, and the names to whom directed; and are put in boxes 10 and 11, in new large envelopes, numbered as the letters.

INDEX No. 2 is to letters addressed *to* Arthur St. Clair—No. 1 to 401; same arrangement as Index No. 1, and are placed in boxes 12, 13, 14 and 15.

INDEX No. 3 is a general index to miscellaneous papers of the same purchase, and are placed in envelopes and portfolios, in boxes Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9.

Besides the contents of these fifteen boxes, there are four large volumes, on the blank pages of which about five hundred letters and other papers have been pasted, and an index made to each volume.
