RULES OF THE STATE LIBRARY.

HOURS.

The Ohio State Library is open every day, except Sunday and the usual holidays.

During the session of the Legislature, from nine o'clock A.M. till twelve M.; from two P.M. to five P.M.; and from seven P.M. to nine P.M.

After the adjournment of the Legislature, from nine A.M. till twelve M., and from two to five P.M.

REGULATIONS.

All persons are permitted to visit the Library and examine and read the books and magazines.

Those who are entitled to take out books are—

By law :

Members and officers and ex-members of the Legislature;

State officers and clerks in the several departments;

The Judges of the Supreme Court and Courts of Common Pleas;

Superintendents in the benevolent and other State institutions.

By resolution :

Resident ministers in the city of Columbus have, by a resolution of the General Assembly, free use of the Library, in accordance with the rules, who are at the time pastors of congregations, and who apply in person for books for their own special use.

The privilege of drawing books from the Library is also extended to the officers and teachers in the benevolent institutions of the State; officers and teachers of the Ohio Agricultural College; officers of the Ohio Penitentiary; ex-officers of the State; ex-officers of the General Assembly, and to the widows of deceased ex-members of the General Assembly and ex-State officers.

RESTRICTIONS.

Not more than two books can be taken by any person at one time within two weeks.

Books must be returned within two weeks.

Books of reference, and other books of peculiar value, are kept from circulation.

A public officer, or any other person having a right to take out books, who gives any other individual an order for books to be used by another not having such right, forfeits his own right to draw books.

Books lost or damaged must be replaced or paid for.

Copying from Library books must be done with pencil.

Loud talking forbidden.

Smoking prohibited.

LIBRARY COMMISSIONERS' REPORT,

1877.

To the General Assembly of Ohio:

The Ohio State Library has now registered nearly forty-four thousand volumes. Increase in the last year, two thousand and sixty-eight.

The character of the books, collected during the official terms of a dozen different librarians, may well challenge admiration, the intrinsic value, in proportion to the number, being very high.

The main Library room, with its appointments, is one of fine taste, in harmony, and of excéeeding pleasantness; and all in all, the Ohio State Library is justly regarded with pride by our people. Independent of those who draw books, and the large number who read or consult them in the room, the Library is now a point of popular attraction. The number of visitors during the past year, including the many excursionists to the Capital from various parts of the State, is probably more than thirty thousand.

The pick of new books, as issued during the year, have been bought. Next, the Philosophical Transactions of the Royal Society, abridged into eighteen volumes, from A.D. 1665 to 1800, and the annual volumes from 1792 to 1874, well bound, were bought from the estate of Ehrenberg, the celebrated naturalist, of Berlin, Prussia, for four hundred and fifty-seven dollars, delivered—a little more than half the market price in London. With the last three volumes, down to 1877, since purchased, the set numbers one hundred and four quartos, a library in itself, as has been remarked, "embracing all science." About one hundred and fifty volumes and bound pamphlets, many of them scarce, relating to money, gold and silver, paper currency and credit, labor and capital, taxation, wages, and kindred subjects of political science, have been secured. In addition, especial attention has been given to the collection of books—now largely out of print, and becoming scarcer and dearer every year—relating to the history of the great West, and to the late war of the Rebellion. There are still large numbers of these books and pamphlets that ought to be obtained without delay.

All who can aid in securing to the Library any books or pamphlets,

or manuscripts relating to the history of the State, its counties, cities, towns, societies, or institutions, are urgently requested to do so.

The intelligent and very industrious services of Miss Mary C. Harbaugh, Assistant Librarian, both in general duties and in the catalogue of new books as received, merits full acknowledgement in this place.

It is earnestly to be hoped that the General Assembly may be liberal in its appropriations to the State Library, that Ohio, in this respect, may not fall behind other States, New York, already largely in advance, and others, even some of the new States, making rapid strides in passing us.
