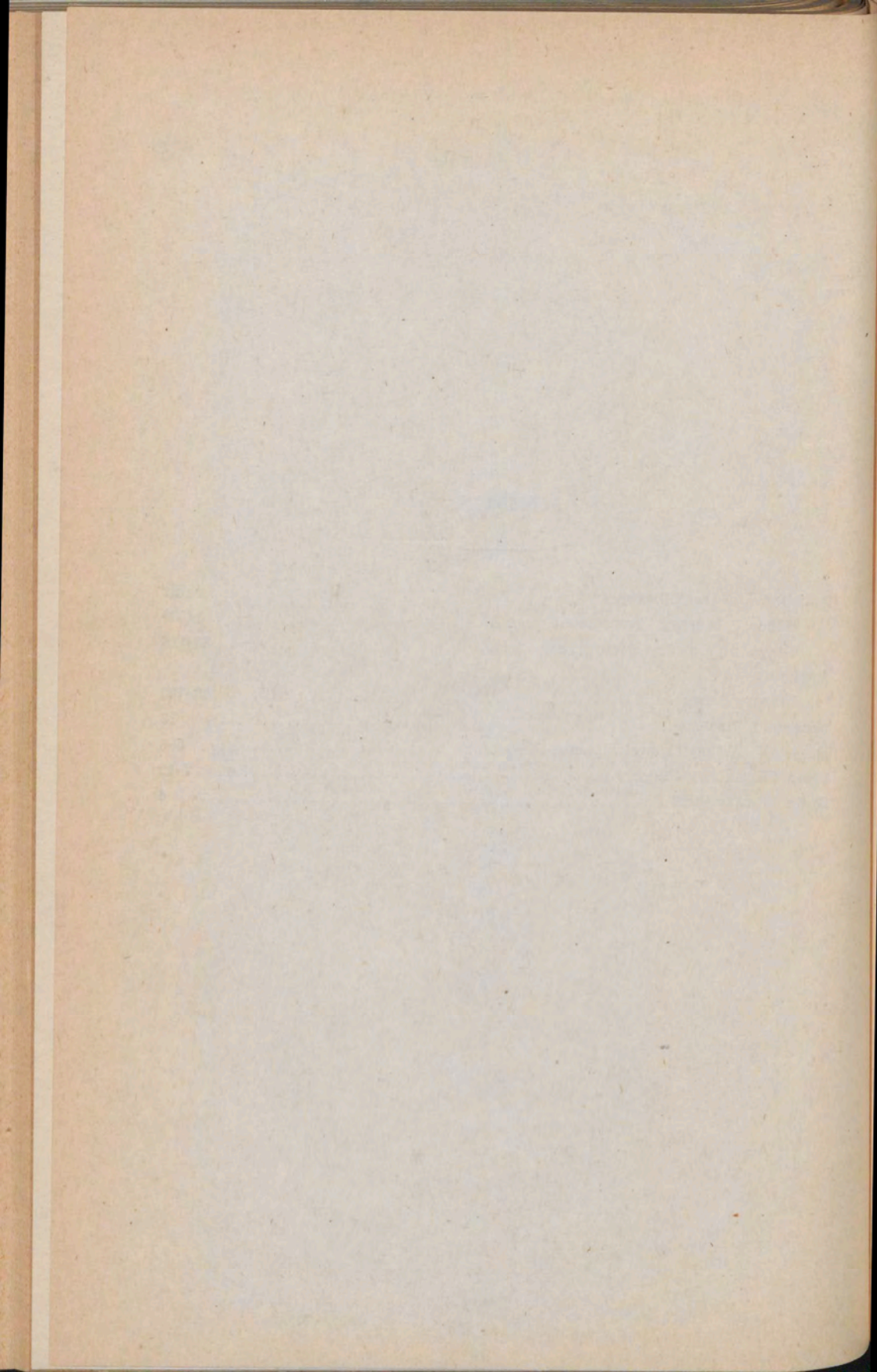

## REPORT OF THE BOARD OF LIBRARY COMMISSIONERS.

COLUMBUS, OHIO, November 15, 1902.

TO HIS EXCELLENCY, GEORGE K. NASH, *Governor of Ohio*:

SIR:—We have the honor to submit herewith the fifty-seventh annual report of the Board of Library Commissioners, and the seventh report under the library act of 1896.

We are pleased to announce what is everywhere evident, continued activity and progress in the library field throughout the State and the prospect for a more substantial growth under the fostering care of recent legislation. It has been our aim to keep the State Library in the current of the progressive tendencies of the times.

The most serious condition that confronts us is the need of more room. We are aware that there is nothing novel or original in this announcement. It is the reiteration of the leading suggestion of our reports for the last three years. While the legislature has, perhaps, not fully understood the extent to which our work has been hindered by the crowded condition of the library, our need has been so obvious that on three occasions additional rooms have been assigned us, none of which have as yet been made accessible. At the extraordinary session of the Seventy-fifth General Assembly, two rooms on the third floor of the capitol and across the court from the main library room, were assigned to the State Library. Unsited as they are to our needs, they seem at present to be the only rooms that can be made available. We sincerely trust that they may be vacated for the use of the library. For lack of shelf room, valuable books and papers are necessarily stacked on the floor. Such a condition should not exist and will not exist if the rooms assigned are made accessible.

The crowded condition of the library is the result of steady growth. Almost 82,000 volumes are now on its shelves. In less than three years the library will number 100,000 volumes. Increasing care has been exercised in supplementing the department of state and local history. Much has been accomplished in this line, and the work so successfully inaugurated and zealously carried on by the librarian bids fair to accomplish even more gratifying results in the near future.

Not only has the library grown in volumes, but statistics for the year show a steadily increasing circulation and use of books as well. The general library department has on its roll 6,000 patrons. A number of these are scholars and special students in different parts of the State. In

1896, the work of the Traveling Library Department began. The year following sixty-two collections of books were issued, and the Commission felt that an important work had been done. In the year that closes to-day, eight hundred and three of these traveling libraries, aggregating 22,031 volumes, have been sent to communities in different parts of the State. It is especially gratifying to report that most of the books circulated through this department have gone to patrons that do not enjoy local library privileges. Records and correspondence in the office of the librarian show that these books are well read and highly appreciated by a long and interesting list of patrons, reaching from primary pupils in rural schools to employes in the oil fields of the northwest; from women's clubs and special study clubs to Sunday schools, Y. M. C. A. and granges. In brief, the field of the State Library has become state-wide, with an opportunity for useful service that may well inspire earnest effort and generous enthusiasm.

In closing this brief report, which is introductory to the following pages herewith submitted, we can not do less than recognize the good work of the librarian and his assistants. While the Board may aid by suggestion and counsel, the work after all must depend upon the library staff. To those who have rendered faithful and efficient service, we extend the assurance of our appreciation and the hope that continued success may reward their labors.

## STATE LIBRARIAN'S REPORT.

COLUMBUS, OHIO, November 15, 1902.

*To the Board of Library Commissioners:*

GENTLEMEN:—I have the honor to submit to you the report of the State Library for the year ending November 15, 1902. Within the past year additions have been made as follows:

To the traveling library department .....	3,687 volumes
To the general library .....	2,564 volumes
Total .....	6,251 volumes
Withdrawn .....	39 volumes
To replace other copies.....	35 volumes      74 volumes
Net increase since last report.....	6,177 volumes

The number of volumes in the State Library at the close of last year was 75,699. This, with the number since added, makes a total of 81,876 volumes.

The following bound volumes added within the past year are worthy of special note.

## NEWSPAPERS AND PERIODICALS.

NEW-HARMONY GAZETTE. OCTOBER 1, 1825—SEPTEMBER 20, 1826.

This paper was issued under the patronage of Robert Owen, the head of the New-Harmony Community, and sets forth his views on questions religious, social and economic. It includes his famous "Oration, containing a declaration of mental independence, delivered in the Public Hall at New-Harmony, Indiana, at the celebration on the Fourth of July, 1826." This periodical can be used with advantage for references from a book issued within the current year, entitled "New-Harmony communities," by George Browning Lockwood, a very valuable work that has just been added to the State Library.

LIBERTY HALL AND CINCINNATI GAZETTE, CINCINNATI CHRONICLE, NEW YORK TRIBUNE, NEW YORK TIMES.

The Public Library of Cincinnati has kindly aided in the work of building up the newspaper department. From its list of duplicates the following volumes have been transferred, at a nominal price, to the State Library.

Liberty Hall and Cincinnati Gazette. June, 1814—July, 1816. Cincinnati Chronicle. June—November, 1841; June—November 1842; June November, 1843; December, 1843—May, 1844. Cincinnati Weekly Chronicle. September 1841—September 1842. New York Tribune May, 1855—August, 1856; January—April 1857. New York Times. September, 1851—May, 1853.

These papers, in part, fill breaks in files already in the library. The New York Tribune is now practically complete. The same is true of the Liberty Hall and Cincinnati Gazette and its various successors, from 1814 to date.

WESTERN COURIER AND PORTAGE COUNTY DEMOCRAT. MAY 2, 1833—  
APRIL 24, 1834.

This file of the Courier was presented to the library by Mr. Purd B. Wright, Librarian of the Public Library, of St. Joseph, Mo. It partially fills a break in the file of the same paper that came into the possession of the State Library one year ago.

WESTERN INTELLIGENCER, WORTHINGTON, OHIO, VOL. 1, NO. 1, JULY 17,  
1811—VOL. 3, NO. 19, JANUARY 1814.

This in some respects, is the most interesting newspaper that has come to the Ohio State Library within the past year. It is the forerunner of the Ohio State Journal. The initial number contains the address to patrons, signed by R. D. Richardson, who conveys the paper to James Kilbourn. It contains also the salutatory to the latter. The Western Intelligencer was moved from Worthington to Columbus early in 1814. Here the name was changed to Columbus Gazette, and later to Ohio State Journal. This file has been loaned to the Ohio State Library by Mrs. Levi Buttles, whose husband was related to Joel Buttles, one of the early editors. It will be kept in the library so long as the owners are satisfied that it will be carefully preserved here. The file is in good condition and practically complete for the period covered. It contains much valuable local history, now for the first time, through the kindness of the Buttles heirs, made accessible to the citizens of Ohio.

THE LITERARY REGISTER. VOL. 1, NO. 1, JUNE 2, 1828—AUGUST 11, 1828.

These numbers form the connecting link between the Literary Focus and The Literary Register, new series, which were presented to the State Library many years ago from the library of James McBride. It completes the file of this early literary publication of Miami University, Oxford, Ohio.

THE CHRISTIAN INTELLIGENCER AND EVANGELICAL GUARDIAN. VOL. 1, NO.  
1, JANUARY 1829—VOL. 8, NO. 12, APRIL, 1838.

This religious periodical was published at Hamilton, Oxford, and Rossville, Ohio, by the "associate reformed synod of the west," and edited



by David Macdill. It contains much of a doctrinal and controversial character, but is valuable also because of the local religious history found on its pages. In the first issue the question of slavery is taken up and considered in a series of articles, running through the first volume. Other questions of the time are also discussed.

#### LADIES' REPOSITORY. CINCINNATI, OHIO.

The later volumes of this magazine, almost completing the set, have recently been added to the library.

#### PROCEEDINGS OF SOCIETIES.

The Journals of the Annual Convention of the Diocese of Ohio, Protestant Episcopal Church, covering a period of forty-three years; Reports of the Cincinnati Chamber of Commerce through its early years; the Proceedings of the Ohio Medical Society, completing the set from 1839, to date, with the exception of one year—all these are additions along lines in which collections can be made and should be made as space and means permit. The State Library should be the repository of the official literature of its associations, religious, scientific, fraternal and industrial.

#### REFERENCE WORKS.

Among the books added by purchase might also be mentioned the Golden Literature of the World's Great Libraries, thirty-three volumes, edited by Richard Garnett, Leon Vallee and Alois Brandl; the first seven volumes of the Victoria History of England, a work to be completed in one hundred and sixty volumes; and Cobbett's Parliamentary History of England, 1066-1803, thirty-six volumes. It is proposed to complete the latter work by the purchase of Handsard's Debates. This will bring down the proceedings of parliament to date.

#### BROUGH FAMILY BIBLE.

An interesting volume acquired by gift is the Brough Family Bible. The donor, Mrs. K. A. Hand-Simpson, of Millburn, N. J., in a letter under date of July 28th, 1902, says:

This Bible is of unknown age. It was brought from England about one hundred years ago by my grandfather whose first name was John. He settled in Marietta, Ohio. He was the father of Colonel Charles Brough and of John Brough, war governor of Ohio.

After the death of John Brough, Sr., the Bible was in the possession and care of the oldest child, Jane, wife of Hugh Terry, until the death of Governor Brough, when she gave it to my mother, the youngest and only other living child of Mr. Brough and wife of Thomas B. Hand. Since her death it has been in my possession. Having no direct heirs, I give the Bible into the keeping of the State of Ohio.

## GIFT FROM W. D. HOWELLS.

William Dean Howells, distinguished son of Ohio and "dean of American letters," presented seven autograph volumes of his works to complete to date the fine de luxe edition now on the shelves of the library.

## LAWSON'S HISTORY OF AMERICA'S CUP.

Nor may we pass over without due acknowledgment the splendid volume, "The Lawson History of America's Cup," presented by the author to the Ohio State Library.

## LITERATURE RELATING TO OHIO—CIRCULAR.

As stated in previous reports, it is the fixed policy of the library to add to its literature relating to Ohio. The following circular, here inserted that it might have a wider circulation, has just been prepared for distribution from this office:

The Ohio State Library is especially desirous of adding to its department of local history. There are already on its shelves histories of nearly all of the counties of the State, many early newspaper files, town histories, and a small collection of Ohio genealogies. It is our purpose to make substantial additions to the literature pertaining to our own State. To this end your cooperation is cordially invited.

The following will indicate the kind of material desired:

1. Ohio newspaper files of earlier date than 1850.
2. Ohio county, city, village or township histories.
3. Books, pamphlets, or other printed material relating to local religious, educational, political and industrial interests; church histories, school histories, addresses,, descriptions of industries, resources, natural scenery.
4. Family genealogies, accounts of family reunions, biographical sketches, obituaries, dairies.

In almost every community there is some person well versed in local history. The State Library is collecting a list of such persons and their addresses. Through correspondence they can materially assist the State Library in its work. We shall be under obligations if you will send us one or more addresses.

Anything that you may do to aid us will be duly recognized and highly appreciated. By a little assistance on the part of those naturally interested, much local history that otherwise would be lost will be preserved and the State Library will receive most valuable aid in this important work.

Notices will also be sent to the press. Encouraging responses are confidently expected.

## SKETCHES OF OHIO LIBRARIES.

The "Sketches of Ohio Libraries" has been published and partially



distributed. Among other things it contains the library laws of the State, including those passed within the current year.

### TRAVELING LIBRARIES.

The traveling library continues to be a popular agency for the distribution of books and a stimulus to library interest and activity. Following is the record of libraries issued within the past year:

The General Assembly, at its last regular session, recognizing the value of the traveling library as an educational agency, made appropriations adequate to its present needs and necessary to the successful continuation of the work of this department.

### LIBRARY LAWS.

The recent decision of the Supreme Court, by implication rendering many of the library laws of the State unconstitutional, was most fortunate for the library interests of Ohio. The free public library is rapidly taking its place among the permanent educational institutions of the State. It has come to stay. For the promotion of its growth and the accomplishment of its beneficent purpose, a wise and liberal law of general application is necessary. Until recently the library laws of Ohio have been a patch-work of special acts. Some were good; some were bad; most of them were obscure and contradictory. The decision of the court has probably set most of them aside. We now have in the place of about forty pages of this legislation four pages of laws enacted at the recent extraordinary session of the General Assembly. The act providing for li-

braries under boards of education, or trustees appointed by them, is as broad in its scope as our free school system. It holds forth the incentive of opportunity to every school district of the state. A liberal levy is made possible in city, village and special school districts. The appropriation authorized for other districts, while not so satisfactory, perhaps, is ample. The rural districts of the State now have full power to establish libraries, and if they so desire, to maintain the traveling library system. A further explanation of the new law, together with directions for organizing under it, will be found in the appendix to this report.

The municipal code, enacted into a law at the extraordinary session of the legislature, provides for the establishment and maintenance of city and village libraries by councils of these municipalities and their administration by a non-partisan board of six trustees appointed by the mayor. The latter feature is especially worthy of commendation. It is most fortunate that the legislation enacted by the General Assembly puts the library interests of the State as far as possible beyond the reach of partisan political influences. The practical unanimity with which these laws were passed has placed the friends of library extension in Ohio under lasting obligations to the Seventy-fifth General Assembly.

#### ADDITIONAL ROOM.

The additional room assigned to the State Library at the regular session of the Seventy-fifth General Assembly has not yet been vacated. At the extraordinary session, the Flag and Relic Rooms on the third floor of the capitol were assigned to the Library. Assurances have been given that these will soon be ready for the use of this department. While they are difficult of access and not suited to our needs, they will afford temporary relief.

The State Library is now adding annually over 6,000 volumes. With ample room this number might easily be increased one-half with comparatively slight additional cost. At the present rate of growth the demand for more space is imperative. We shall soon be face to face with a condition that can be met only by the erection of a new library building. Andrew Carnegie has presented for library buildings in Ohio alone \$750,000. In the midst of the present rapid library development on every hand, when private philanthropy is doing so much, assuredly the State of Ohio, proud of her past, ambitious to hold advanced position in the progressive present and financially able to meet every reasonable demand, can well afford to provide for her own library—the chief depository of her written history and the institution that is designed, under the Garfield Act of 1896, to come into cooperative contact with the other libraries of the State.

# LIBRARY LAWS

Passed at the Extraordinary Session of the Seventy-fifth  
General Assembly.

---

(Senate Bill No. 8, by Mr. Harrison.)

## AN ACT.

Authorizing boards of education to provide library privileges for city, village  
and special school districts.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Ohio.*

SECTION 1. (Board of education may provide for the establishment, control and maintenance of public library; tax, levy.) That the board of education of any city, village or special school district may, by resolution, provide for the establishment, control and maintenance, in such school district, of a public library, free to all the inhabitants of such district, and for that purpose may acquire by purchase the necessary real property, and erect thereon a library building; it may acquire from any library association, by purchase or otherwise, its library and property; may receive donations and bequests of money or property for such library purposes and may maintain and support libraries now in existence and controlled by the board of education; and such board of education may annually make a levy upon the taxable property of such school district, in addition to all other taxes allowed by law, of not to exceed one mill for a library fund to be expended by such board of education, for the establishment, support and maintenance of such public library.

SECTION 2. (Board of education may elect a board of library trustees; powers and duties of trustees.) The board of education may provide for the management and control of such library by a board of trustees to be elected by said board of education as herein provided. Such board of library trustees shall consist of seven members, who shall be residents of the school district, and no one shall be eligible to membership on said library board who is or has been for a year previous to his election, a member or officer of the board of education. The term of office shall be such that one member shall retire each year. Should a vacancy occur in said board, it shall be filled by the board of education for the unexpired term. The members of said library board shall serve without compensation and until



their successors are elected and qualified. Such library board in its own name shall hold the title to and have the custody, management and control of all libraries, branches, stations, reading rooms, and of all library property, real and personal, of such school district, and the the expenditure of all moneys collected or received from any source for library purposes for such district. It shall have power to employ a librarian and assistants, but previous to such employment the compensation of such librarian and assistants shall be fixed. Such library board shall have the power, by a two-thirds vote of its members, to purchase or lease grounds and buildings, and erect buildings for library purposes. It may accept any gift, devise, or bequest for the benefit of such library. No member of the library board shall be interested, directly or indirectly, in any contract made by the board. The library board shall report annually in writing to the board of education.

**SECTION 3. (Election of library trustees—when mandatory.)** Whenever in any city, village or special school district a library established or controlled by a board of education shall contain twenty-five thousand or more volumes, it shall be managed, governed and controlled by a board of trustees elected by a board of education as provided in Section 2 of this act.

**SECTION 4. (Board of library trustees to certify tax levy to board of education; board of education to make levy.)** Said board of library trustees shall annually, during the month of May, certify to the board of education the amount of money that will be needed for increasing, maintaining and operating said library during the ensuing year in addition to the funds available therefor from other sources; and such board of education shall annually levy on each dollar of taxable property within said school district, in addition to all other levies authorized by law, such assessment not exceeding one mill, as shall be necessary to realize the sum so certified, the same to be placed on the tax duplicate and collected as other taxes. The proceeds of the said tax shall constitute a fund to be known and designated as the library fund. Payments therefrom shall only be made upon the warrant of the board of trustees of the library, signed by the president and secretary thereof.

**SECTION 5. (Board of education may contract for use of library.)** The board of education in any city, village or special school district shall have power to contract annually with any library corporation or other organization owning and maintaining a library, for the use of such library by the residents of such district, and it shall have power to levy annually a tax not exceeding one mill on the taxable property of such district to pay for the same; and such board of education shall



require an annual report in writing from such library corporation or other organization.

SECTION 6. (Board of education may appropriate money for school library.) The board of education of any school district of the state, in which there is not a public library operated under public authority and free to all the residents of such district, may appropriate annually not to exceed two hundred and fifty dollars from its contingent fund for the purchase of books, other than school books, for the use and improvement of the teachers and pupils of such school district. The books so purchased shall constitute a school library, the control and management of which shall be vested in the board of education, which board shall have power to receive donations and bequests of money or property for such library.

SECTION 7. (Board of education may found and maintain museum.) The board of education of any school district, or any board of trustees managing and controlling a library in any school district, may found and maintain a museum in connection with and as an adjunct to such library, and for such purpose may receive bequests and donations of money or other property.

SECTION 8. This act shall take effect and be in force on and after November 15, 1902, and all acts or parts of acts not inconsistent herewith under which existing libraries are maintained, governed and controlled, shall be and remain in full force and effect.

## MUNICIPAL CODE—PROVISIONS RELATIVE TO PUBLIC LIBRARIES.

### GENERAL POWERS OF MUNICIPALITIES.

SECTION 7. \* \* \* All municipal corporations shall have the following general powers and council may provide by ordinance or resolution for the exercise and enforcement of the same: \* \* \*

(7-22.) To establish, maintain and regulate free public libraries and reading rooms, and to purchase books, papers, maps and manuscripts therefor, and to receive donations and bequests of money or property for the same, in trust or otherwise, and to provide for the rent and compensation for the use of any existing free public libraries



established and managed by a private corporation or association organized for that purpose.

#### APPROPRIATION OF PROPERTY.

SECTION 10. All municipal corporations shall have power to appropriate, enter upon and hold, real estate within their corporate limits, for the following purposes: \* \* \*

(10-8.) For libraries, university sites and grounds for the same.

#### TAXATION.

SECTION 33. The aggregate of all taxes levied by any municipal corporation, exclusive of the levy for county and state purposes, for schools and school house purposes, for free public libraries, and library buildings, for university and observatory purposes, for hospitals, and for sinking fund and interest, on each dollar of valuation of taxable property in the corporation on the tax list, shall not exceed in any one year ten mills.

#### ADMINISTRATION, MAINTENANCE AND SUPPORT.

SECTION 218. (Trustees; duties; quorum.) The custody, control and administration, together with the erection and equipment, of free public libraries established by municipal corporations, shall be vested in six trustees, not more than three of whom shall belong to the same political party, who shall be appointed by the mayor to serve without compensation for a term of four years and until their successors are appointed and qualified; provided, however, that in the first instance three of such trustees shall be appointed for a term of two years, and three thereof for a term of four years, and all vacancies shall be filled by like appointment for the unexpired term. Said trustees shall employ the librarians and necessary assistants, fix their compensation, adopt the necessary by-laws and regulations for the protection and government of the libraries and all property belonging thereto, and exercise all the powers and duties connected with and incident to the government, operation and maintenance thereof. It shall require four of said trustees to constitute a quorum and four votes to pass any measure or authorize any act, which votes shall be taken by the yeas and nays and entered on the record of proceedings of said trustees, and in the making of contracts said trustees shall be governed by the provisions of law applicable thereto.

(Council may provide for use and maintenance of library; tax; report). The council of each city shall have power to levy and collect

a tax not exceeding one mill on each dollar of the taxable property of the municipality, annually, and to pay the same to a private corporation or association maintaining and furnishing a free public library for the benefit of the inhabitants of the municipality as and for compensation for the use and maintenance of the same, and without change or interference in the organization of such corporation or association, requiring the treasurer of such corporation or association to make an annual financial report, setting forth all the money and property which has come into his hands during the preceding year, and its disposition of the same, together with any recommendation as to its future necessities.

### NOTES ON PRECEDING LAWS.

The preceding laws, enacted at the extraordinary session of the Seventy-fifth General Assembly, and drafted to meet the requirements of recent decisions of the Supreme Court, are general in character and the most liberal placed on our statute books since the repeal of the Library Act of 1853. They make a free public library possible in every community of the State. As they repeal conflicting laws previously enacted, it will be safest to organize public libraries in accordance with the Harrison Act, or the provisions of the Municipal Code.

#### LIBRARY ORGANIZATION UNDER BOARD OF EDUCATION.

Sections 1, 2, 3 and 4 of the act authorizing certain boards of education "to provide library privileges" are self-explanatory.

Section 5 gives boards of education the power to contract for the use of a library, which may be located in the city, village or special school district, or outside of it. The contract must be renewed annually and a report must be made in writing each year to the board of education. The board has no authority over the membership or management of the library organization. This section will not only protect libraries that were operating under a similar provision previous to its enactment, but also, it is believed, encourage private and subscription libraries to open to the public in return for the tax levy now authorized.

Section 6 is designed to take the place of a law enacted at the regular session of the Seventy-fifth General Assembly. It makes possible the establishment and maintenance of a library in any school district of the State. It applies not only to city, village and special



districts in which there is not a public library, but to township districts as well. Under it the control and management of the library is vested in the board of education, which board may use any agency, including the traveling library system, for the distribution of books.

#### LIBRARY ORGANIZATION UNDER MUNICIPAL CODE.

The authority of the city or village council to establish, maintain and, through a non-partisan board of trustees, to provide for the administration of, public libraries is clearly set forth in Sections 7, 10, 33 and 218 of the new Municipal Code. It will be seen that a city council only has power to contract with a corporation or association for the free use of its library. This power cannot be exercised by a village council. The village school board, however, has such power under Section 5 of the Harrison Act.

#### HOW TO ESTABLISH A PUBLIC LIBRARY.

Under the comprehensive laws now in force a free public library is possible in every community in Ohio. These laws, however, are permissive in character. The citizens of a community must realize the need of a public library before one can be established. The local interest must be aroused. Often it will be best to establish a library, in a modest way, by contributions of money and donations of books. Traveling libraries may also be borrowed from the State for this purpose. The books collected from any or all of these sources should be made to circulate as freely as possible, and the public should be encouraged to ask for more books. The material selected and the spirit manifested by those who have the work in charge will go far toward making the experiment a success. The expense need not be large. A small outlay of money, supplemented with earnest missionary work, will accomplish much. When the service is such as to win the appreciation of the public, it will be comparatively easy to proceed with the establishment of the library.

The local press may aid materially in this preparatory work. The attitude of newspaper men is naturally friendly to educational movements. If their support is solicited in the proper spirit, they will, as a rule, generously and effectively promote the movement. The support of the local newspaper is so important that it should be assured before the establishment of a public library is seriously undertaken.

"Enlist the support of teachers, and through them interest children and parents. Literary, art, social, and scientific societies, Chau-



tauqua' circles, local clubs of all kinds should be champions of the movement." \*

With a friendly interest assured, petitions addressed to the board of education or the city council should be drawn up and circulated throughout the district or municipality for signatures. These should be presented to all citizens. No class should be slighted. The committee appointed to solicit names should represent the various local interests. It is fair to presume that every citizen, when he becomes acquainted with the educational value of the free public library, will be friendly to the movement. Personal rivalries must be avoided. The work must be undertaken in a public spirit. It must be thoroughly understood that the good of the community is the aim and end of library extension.

When the petitions have been signed, they should be submitted to the board of education or municipal council. If the preliminary work has been well done, success is practically assured. The body to whom the petitions are submitted will usually be very willing to act in accordance with the expressed wish of their constituents.

In some instances the preliminary steps here suggested may not be necessary. Where the local interest is already manifest a resolution may be introduced in the board of education or municipal council by a member of either body, providing for the establishment of a free public library.

The work preparatory to the establishment of a library depends to some extent on local conditions. Those who have assumed this undertaking will know best how details are to be managed. When a start is once made the project should not be lightly abandoned. In many instances, everything will depend upon earnest, conscientious, long-sustained effort. Spasms are to be avoided. This is a work in which perseverance is essential. Till public aid can be secured, a small library supported as already suggested is a great improvement over no library at all, and the most efficient means to cultivate sentiment in favor of a free public library.

In organizing a school library in township districts or districts in which there is not "a public library operated under public authority and free to all the residents of such districts," it will often be sufficient to present a petition from the teachers to the board of education. If it is found necessary to arouse interest preparatory to this step, traveling libraries may be borrowed from the State Library and used through one winter to demonstrate the utility and practicability of the system.

The limit of money that may be appropriated annually in such districts is \$250.00. We will suppose that the township includes ten

sub-districts. Evenly divided, this gives twenty-five dollars to each, a sum sufficient to purchase a case and twenty books suitable for use in the schools. The case purchased should be sufficiently large to accommodate at least thirty volumes. Books may be added in the year following to supplement these little collections, for convenience called traveling libraries.

It is understood that these books should be carefully selected with reference to the needs and capacities of the prospective readers, and there should be few, if any, duplicates. At the opening of the schools a traveling library should be placed in each school room ready for use. At the end of two or three months there should be an exchange of libraries. The books should be called in on a certain day, and a man employed to make the exchange throughout the township. This can be very easily arranged. A traveling library may be transferred from one of the schools to the adjoining district, the library there taken up, and in a similar way carried to the next school. This can be done very promptly and at a trifling expense, as the box of books is so light that it may be conveyed in a buggy or sleigh from district to district. In this way the pupils and patrons of each district will, in time, have access to the books in all the libraries.

The general management of the libraries should be in the hands of a competent and responsible person, and reports should be required at regular intervals. This is all important, as the success of the system is dependent upon efficient administration. Where there is a township superintendent, he should have the management of the traveling libraries, and where there is a central high school, it should be the depository for the libraries, when the schools are not in session. It should also have a permanent library, accessible to its pupils, and for purposes of reference to the people of the entire township.

That such a system is feasible has been demonstrated by actual experience in Ohio and other states. In our own state the field has been limited because private contributions have been the only source of support. Under the new law every township, if its board of education so desires, may have its system of traveling libraries.

The ideal toward which the township board should work is a carefully selected permanent library in each sub-district, and, if there be one, a larger library at the central high school. The traveling library system may be used as a temporary aid to this end. As already stated, too much emphasis cannot be placed on the importance of efficient administration. An essential rule to be observed is compressed in a single sentence: Keep the books in circulation and do not lose them. Much of the prejudice against the purchase of books and apparatus for schools is due to the carelessness with which this property is often managed after it has been purchased. Every teacher should



be held to a strict account for the library in his school, and provision should be made for the safe keeping of the books when the schools are not in session. Fortunate is the township that has a superintendent of schools who will assume responsibility for this important work. Ohio already has a number of such who are rendering excellent service. With the centralization of schools now in progress and a growing interest in the extension of library privileges to villages and rural districts, it is hoped that township supervision may have a wider field.

#### ASSISTANCE FROM THE STATE LIBRARY.

The State Library Act of 1896, under which the library commission operates, provides, among other things, that "the librarian or trustees of any free public library may ask said board of library commissioners for advice as to all matters pertaining to the organization, maintenance or administration of the library; and the board shall give such advice and personal attention as it shall find practicable." It will be at all times the pleasure of the commissioners, as it is their duty, to comply with the letter and spirit of this section of the law. Correspondence is invited with those interested in the establishment and maintenance of public libraries. Within the limit of their power to serve, the commissioners will be more than pleased to assist in the work of library extension throughout the State.

That the public library is a part of the educational system should never be lost sight of in the work of establishing it, or in its management. To the great mass of people it comes as their first and only educational opportunity. The largest part of every man's education is that which he gives himself. It is for this individual, self-administered education that the public library furnishes the opportunity and the means. The schools start education in childhood; libraries carry it on.

Libraries are needed to furnish the incentive and the opportunity for wider study to the pupils of the schools; to give to the mechanic and artisan a chance to know what their ambitious fellows are doing; to give to men and women, weary and worn from treading a narrow round, excursions into fresh and delightful fields; to give clubs for study and amusement material for better work, and, last but not least, to give wholesome employment to all classes for those idle hours that wreck more lives than any other cause.
