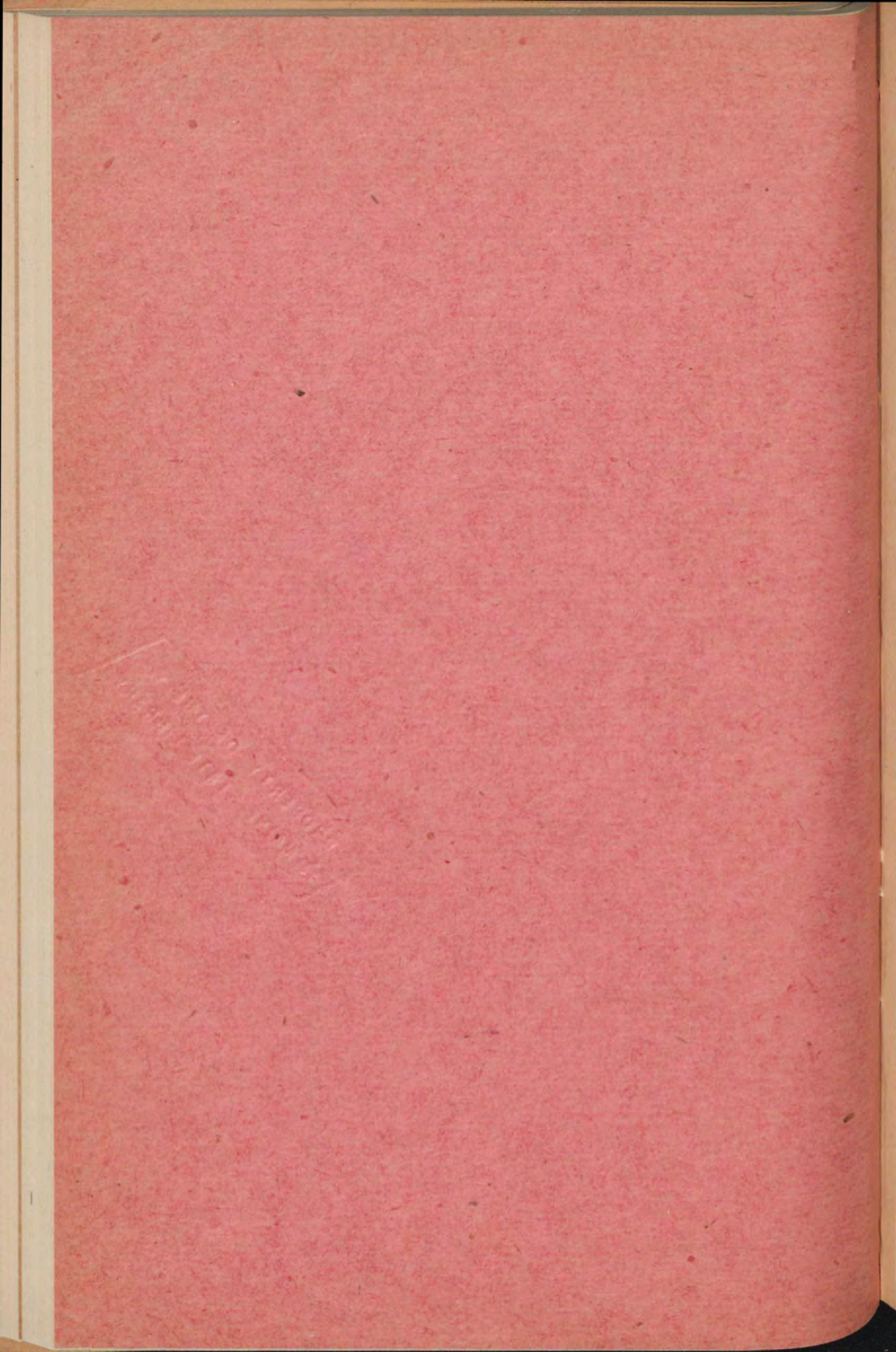

## STATE LIBRARIAN'S REPORT.

Columbus, Ohio, Nov. 15th, 1897.

To the Library Commissioners of Ohio:

Gentlemen:—In compliance with your requirement I have the honor to submit the fifty-second annual report of the Ohio State Library. The past year has been one of unusual activity among the friends of the library movement throughout the state, as evidenced by the correspondence of this office, the increased demand for books, and frequent requests for suggestions in regard to the establishment of new libraries. These new demands and the work commenced one year ago have kept very busily engaged the library staff and such additional help as limited contingent appropriations permit. At the opening of this report I submit a brief statement of

### WHAT HAS BEEN DONE WITHIN THE YEAR.

The classification of the entire library has been completed and revised. The books have been cleaned, labeled, marked, and arranged. This necessitated the moving of all volumes, some of them a number of times. A shelf list has been prepared and is now ready for publication. A bulletin of additions to the library was issued June 1st. The check-list of state publications, compiled by Hon. R. P. Hayes, has been printed. Book stacks have been furnished for the Congressional record, patent office reports, and other works of reference. Boxes have been provided for traveling libraries and an earnest effort has been made to increase the efficiency of the State Library as a purveyor of healthful literature to the public.

### STATE PUBLICATIONS AND PUBLICATIONS RELATING TO THE STATE.

One of the primary objects of a state library is the preservation of the documents of the state and works descriptive of its resources and its history. The preparation of the check-list of state publications revealed the fact that the collection in the state library is not entirely complete. An effort will be made to supply the few missing volumes. The check-list will serve as a safeguard against future losses.

The collection of works relating to the state is still comparatively meagre. The leading histories of Ohio are found on the shelves as are also the histories of the different counties and larger cities, but much local



matter of a scientific and historical character is conspicuously wanting. In the departments of geology and botany there is little outside of the state survey. Genealogies of Ohio families are comparatively rare. The literature of the anti-slavery movement is not represented by a single periodical published in the interest of that cause. Steps have already been taken to supply these deficiencies and we hope by the end of another year to report substantial progress.

#### DISTRIBUTION OF STATE PUBLICATIONS.

Attention is again called to the distribution of state publications, and the recommendations of one year ago are renewed. This work would be greatly facilitated by the enactment of a law that would empower the public printer to furnish the library with a specified number of each publication issued by the state. The supply should be sufficient to provide a reasonable number of duplicates for the library, to enable it to carry on exchanges with other states, and to meet the demand of other libraries within the state. Pennsylvania has a similar law. The library of that commonwealth receives two hundred copies of every state publication.

#### HOWE'S HISTORICAL COLLECTIONS.

The law provides no copies of this valuable historical work for free distribution within the state. Sets may be had from the Secretary of State at two dollars each. If it could be furnished free to new libraries as they are established, it would place them on an equality with those already supplied. The price, however, is very low and any new library will doubtless find some liberal patron who will purchase and donate the work.

#### REFERENCE WORKS—PERIODICAL LITERATURE.

Reference works and periodical literature do not belong to the circulating department of the library. The same is true of rare and valuable books. Patrons wishing to consult these must come to the library or arrange to have some one here collect and furnish the desired information. Their inquiries will receive prompt attention, and assistance requiring a reasonable amount of extra labor will be cheerfully given.

#### CATALOGUE.

The preparation of a complete catalogue of all the books in the library with extensive cross-references would require much time and cost many thousand dollars. While it would be very helpful to attendants and patrons, its publication may be safely deferred until the more pressing



needs of the library are met. A subject and another catalogue, similar to those used in the Carnegie libraries of Pittsburg and Alleghany, could be provided at a very small expense. The preparatory work has already been practically completed. The demand for such a catalogue is very pressing. Patrons outside of the city of Columbus desire to know, before making a choice, what books can be furnished them. This is especially true of literary clubs and small libraries.

Almost every day requests come to this office for a list of the books in the circulating department of the library. It is hoped that means will be provided to meet this demand at the earliest possible date.

### LIBRARY MEETINGS.

The American Library Association held its annual meeting in Philadelphia, June 21-25. The next session will be held at Chautauqua, N. Y. The Ohio State Library Association had a pleasant and profitable session in the city of Cincinnati, Oct. 27-28. The time and place of holding the next meeting have not been determined. The Ohio State Teachers' Association organized a library section at its annual meeting in Toledo. Much is expected from this movement as it brings into contact two great educational agencies of the state.

### LIBRARY LAWS.

The library laws of Ohio were published as an appendix to the last annual report. Copies may be had by writing to this office.

### TRAVELING LIBRARIES.

It is gratifying to report that a number of traveling libraries have gone to different parts of the state within the past year. There can be no question that, with proper aid, they will prove popular and potent adjuncts to our educational system. The demand for them has already surpassed the sanguine expectations of the friends of the movement. Sixty-one libraries have been sent out. The mail for the past week has brought applications for blanks at the rate of five a day. From this correspondence one might be led to suppose that the people had been ready and waiting for the opportunity to borrow books. It is encouraging that this demand is not confined to any class or section. The Federation of Women's Clubs was first to make application, possibly because officials of that organization were first apprised of the opportunity. Next came the demand from the public schools, chiefly those in rural districts and small villages where there are no public libraries. And last, but by no means least important, come the strangers of the state through their local organizations to test the practical value of the system. The testimony of all these will perhaps most fittingly exhibit what has been done and what may be done.



## TRAVELING LIBRARIES AND THE FEDERATION OF WOMEN'S CLUBS.

The General Federation of Women's Clubs was the first organization in the state to ask for traveling libraries. Oct. 9th, 1896, the first was sent to the Monday Club of Mt. Vernon, Ohio, Miss Nora Mulhane, secretary. Thus far these clubs lead in the number of applications. The following extract from correspondence on file will indicate their interest in the system:

FROM THE ALTRURIAN CLUB, TROY, OHIO.

November 7th, 1897.

.....

The library is still in circulation among our Club members who are quite enthusiastic over the good they derive from the books. How we could have carried out our program in the thorough manner we have so far, without them, I can't imagine. I hope we may be able to have more libraries and more books in them in the near future. They are surely needed.

WOMAN'S FORTNIGHTLY CLUB, ASHTABULA, O. O.

October 1st, 1897.

.....

We appreciate the wisdom of the planners of this beneficent scheme.

FROM AN OFFICER OF THE OHIO FEDERATION OF WOMEN'S CLUBS.

Springfield, Ohio, September 23rd, 1897.

.....

I wish to say that not a day passes that does not bring expressions of gratitude for the library law of 1896 and for the generous treatment of the Ohio Federation of Clubs by the State Library Commission.

FROM THE 1890 CLUB OF TIFFIN, OHIO.

September 7th, 1897.

.....

Our president and other ladies who have seen the list of books are much pleased with your selection and have already taken out some of the volumes. I expect them all to be taken out before Saturday evening.

It is but fair to state that while many officers and members of the Ohio Federation of Women's Clubs have taken especial interest in the traveling library movement, the work of Mrs. C. B. Buchwalter of Springfield, Ohio, deserves especial mention. Extracts from her report to the Federation will be found on another page.

## TRAVELING LIBRARIES AND THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

While the Women's Clubs have been the pioneers in this work, letters addressed to this office within the past month indicate that the common schools of the state will soon furnish the largest number of patrons. The first traveling library sent to them was shipped to Mutual, Champaign County, Ohio, for the Yankee Hill School, Elba W. Pence, teacher and librarian. We quote briefly from his last report:

Mutual, Ohio, November 1st, 1897.

.....

I can certify in behalf of the Yankee Hill Library Association that the books are receiving good care at the hands of parents and pupils. School is now in session again. I am striving to instill in the minds of pupils a love for reading, which is growing as their knowledge grows. I therefore wish very much that you would grant us the privilege of the continued use of the library. It is our intention to have a reading circle of pupils, and when we get this started the library will be used very much. We are well pleased with the selection of books you sent us.

---

FROM MILLER CITY, OHIO.

November 6th, 1897.

.....

I am trying to create in the pupils a taste for good literature, and the use of the State Library books is an experiment. At first I talked about the books, told some interesting things that might be found in them, and gave each pupil a book to take home and keep two weeks. At first they were only looked into and laid aside. But by meeting with the pupils and reading selected portions I am able to see quite a lively interest manifested. These meetings were held weekly in the evenings.

The pupils seem never to have had suggested to them before the idea of reading a book which was not a text book.

We desire the books another month, and when they are finally returned I shall make you a complete report as to their use.

APPLICATION FROM TOWN WITH NO PUBLIC LIBRARY.

September 13th, 1897.

.....

Our town of about three thousand population has no public library. The mills and factories employ about three hundred children between the ages of fourteen and twenty-one years. About thirty per cent of the children in our public schools drop out and engage in work in the various factories as soon as they reach the age of fourteen years. I believe that a good percentage of the young men and young ladies could be interested in a systematic course of reading if we had a library. There are very few people of wealth living in the community. Will you kindly inform me how we are to proceed?



## TRAVELING LIBRARY AND THE GRANGE.

To C. M. Freeman, Lecturer of the State Grange, Rex, Ohio, is due the credit of introducing this system to the Granges of the state. He visited the state library to learn how books might be secured for the farmers. In the Ohio State Grange Quarterly Bulletin, of which he is editor, he says:

"If there were more home libraries there would be less demand for social and public libraries, but in their absence the demand is great. So in the Grange, if the members were all well supplied with private libraries, the demand would not be so great for Grange libraries. The personal experience and observation of the members is very good so far as it goes, but it is limited in any society. To branch out, to cover a wider range of subjects or to pursue further those subjects with which we are partially familiar, we must call to our assistance those who possess the information after which we seek. We can more readily secure what we want through books than to attempt to obtain it from personal lectures, for today there is scarcely a subject that has not been written upon. It is evident then that we need books. We need them in the home, in the public library, and in the Grange. How to get more books into Granges is the subject before us and one I have studied considerably.

Not only will a good library assist the lecturer in having a good program, but it will create a reading interest among the members. A great many boys and girls in the farmers' homes are starving for the want of good books. The Grange library will afford them a splendid opportunity, and if you have none, your organization is in shape to readily get a "Traveling Library" in your community, which will not only accommodate the boys and girls, but the parents as well. \* \* \*

While the State Library has a large collection of books, in fitting up a "Traveling Library" for the farmer, he (the State Librarian) would need some additional books dealing directly with agricultural topics. These he assured me would be forthcoming whenever the demand was made for them, and I am anxious for the Grange to create a demand. We have as much right to these libraries, as any one. Let us not be slow in going after them. \* \* \* The leisure months for the farmers are here and now is the time to provide reading for the winter."

Mr. Freeman then proceeds in a very practical way to instruct the Granges how to effect an organization and apply for traveling libraries. The state library can testify that his suggestions have called forth a very hearty response from the Granges.

W. H. Hamilton, Lecturer of Darby Grange, No. 779, West Jefferson, Ohio, has the honor of receiving the first library sent out to such an organization.



## TRAVELING LIBRARIES AND OTHER ORGANIZATIONS.

One of these has been sent to the Congregational Sunday-school at Rootstown, Ohio, M. L. Stahl, librarian. Another was sent to the Orton Reading Club, Grand Rapids, Ohio. Mr. Azor Thurston, librarian of the club, under date of Nov. 10th, 1897, says:

"We very much appreciate the courtesy of the librarian in allowing us to retain the books so long; and think we can say that all volumes have been carefully handled. This arrangement of traveling libraries is a great boon to the districts which have not access to large collections of books."

## CONCLUSION.

In conclusion I wish again to urge the importance of providing for the new demand that the traveling library brings. In the larger towns and cities of the state the library is considered an important educational auxiliary. It supplements the work of the schools by furnishing healthful literature for pupils and for those whose school days are ended—who have graduated into the busy world to engage in the arduous struggle for "food and shelter and raiment." Fortunate indeed for them if the evening brings the opportunity to commune, through the medium of books, with the master minds of all ages;—to wander among the monuments of nations that were,—to walk with travelers through far away lands,—to pause, awe inspired, in the shadow of great temples,—to pass enraptured through galleries of art,—to marvel at the wizard work of inventive genius,—to stand in the presence of those "splendid prodigies" that have made the world's history,—to witness the progress of the race toward light and liberty. Fortunate indeed. For them.

"The cares that infest the day  
Shall fold their tents, like the Arab,  
And as silently steal away."

But this is sentiment; let us be practical. Good books are safe friends; the best never grow old. It is for the great State of Ohio to say whether or not they shall go on their beneficent mission to those who are waiting and calling for them.

## Appendix.

### TRAVELING LIBRARIES.

Objects: 1.—To furnish good literature to the public. 2.—To strengthen small libraries. 3.—To create an interest in the establishment of new libraries.

A Traveling Library is a collection of twenty-five books sent out by the State Library to a reading club, an association of citizens, a board of education or a public library, to be kept at least one month. Permission may be given to retain it three months, with privilege of renewal.

The State Library will furnish forms for bond and application to those wishing to receive a Traveling Library.

On receipt of a request on the forms furnished by the State Library, properly filled out by the members of the club, board of education or association, or by the officers of a free public library, the books will be shipped. The parties receiving the books must pay transportation both ways.

If a list of the books desired is sent with the application, it will be furnished as nearly as possible; if only the general subjects are named, books relating to those subjects will be sent.

The Ohio State Library desires a wider circulation for its Traveling Libraries. Those interested are invited to correspond.

## OHIO FEDERATION OF WOMEN'S CLUBS.

Extracts from Annual Report by Chairman of Committee, Mrs. C. B. Buchwalter.

While extension of the use of books and furnishing them in all ways practicable is the broad purpose of this committee, this report will only deal with its relations to the State Library and the results of the offer, so generously made to the State Federation in the convention assembled at Cleveland. The clubs were told there that they could have the books from the State Library, the clubs paying transportation both ways. Twenty clubs fulfilled the modest requirements, sent for, and received books. Many others sent for application blanks, which, however, were not filled out and sent back to the State Library. The inference is, that owing to the lateness of the season, the clubs decided not to send for books. That this is the proper inference is shown by the increased demand for books for use during the current year. Thirty-nine libraries have already been sent out and there have been many more requests for application blanks.

The cordial treatment by the Library Commissioners which was reported last year continues, and the generous attitude of the State Librarian and Assistant Librarian toward the State Federation remains unchanged. Club interests are as carefully guarded as are the interests of the state. As an instance of this, your committee could refer to the fact that in making up a list of books to go in a Club Library, record is made of any defacement or defect of any book that is to go in the library, thus protecting the club.

Another notable benefit which the clubs will receive and which was not "nominated in the bond" are the carefully prepared lists of magazine articles covering subjects studied by each club.

These libraries have necessarily had many limitations because they were made up from the books already on the shelves. It is hoped that the next legislature will make a specific appropriation for Traveling Libraries. One reason we are often misrepresented is because we have no clearly defined idea of what we want. Your committee hopes that the club women have already seen enough good accomplished by Traveling Libraries to warrant them in working heartily for this appropriation.



The outlook is full of promise in that the clubs are availing themselves of the use of the books, and it is believed that the influence of the club women of the state, judiciously exerted, combined with the active work of the State Library Association will secure an appropriation, which will give us a system of Traveling Libraries of which Ohio will be proud.

### U. S. DOCUMENTS.

A hand book recently issued by the Wisconsin Free Library Commission contains the following hints to help in the perplexing problem of how to obtain copies of government publications:

"It is not easy to give the information you ask for as to the classes of public documents that can be obtained by small free public libraries, because what can be obtained depends so largely on the enterprise and 'gumption' of the librarian. One who knows how may obtain almost everything that is worth having, while one who is dilatory and inaccurate about asking may get almost nothing."

"Members of Congress have allotments of the cloth editions of almost all the documents that libraries want. These allotments are often small, and the earliest applicants are the only ones who can be supplied. The librarian who keeps herself informed of what is being published and asks for it promptly will usually get it. If such an enterprising librarian finds that her Senator or Representative does not respond to her requests, she has another recourse, namely, the Bureau, or Division, or Survey or Commission, or office by which the desired document is published. Every government office that prepares books for publication has a supply of its own books for free distribution. Frequently the number is small, and prompt application is advisable in dealing with a Bureau as well as with a member of Congress. If sets are desired, it is often practicable for a library, by judicious application, made in a way to show that an intelligent use will be made of the publications, to get on the permanent mailing lists of the Bureau of Education, the Department of Labor, the Fish Commission, the Office of Experiment Stations in the Department of Agriculture, or other publishing offices whose bulletins or reports may be desired by the library. These are the only permanent lists open to most small libraries. The time to apply for the Congressional Record and the Congressional Directory is at the opening, or shortly before the opening, of each session of Congress. Then the mailing lists are made up. There is no source of free supply for these publications except the favor of Senators and Representatives, and their allotments are comparatively limited, so that late applicants are likely to be disappointed. Members of Congress can supply either the numbers of the Record issued daily during the session or the complete work in bound volumes issued after the close of the session. The daily numbers may be preserved and bound, but they will not agree in pagination with the government's bound volumes."

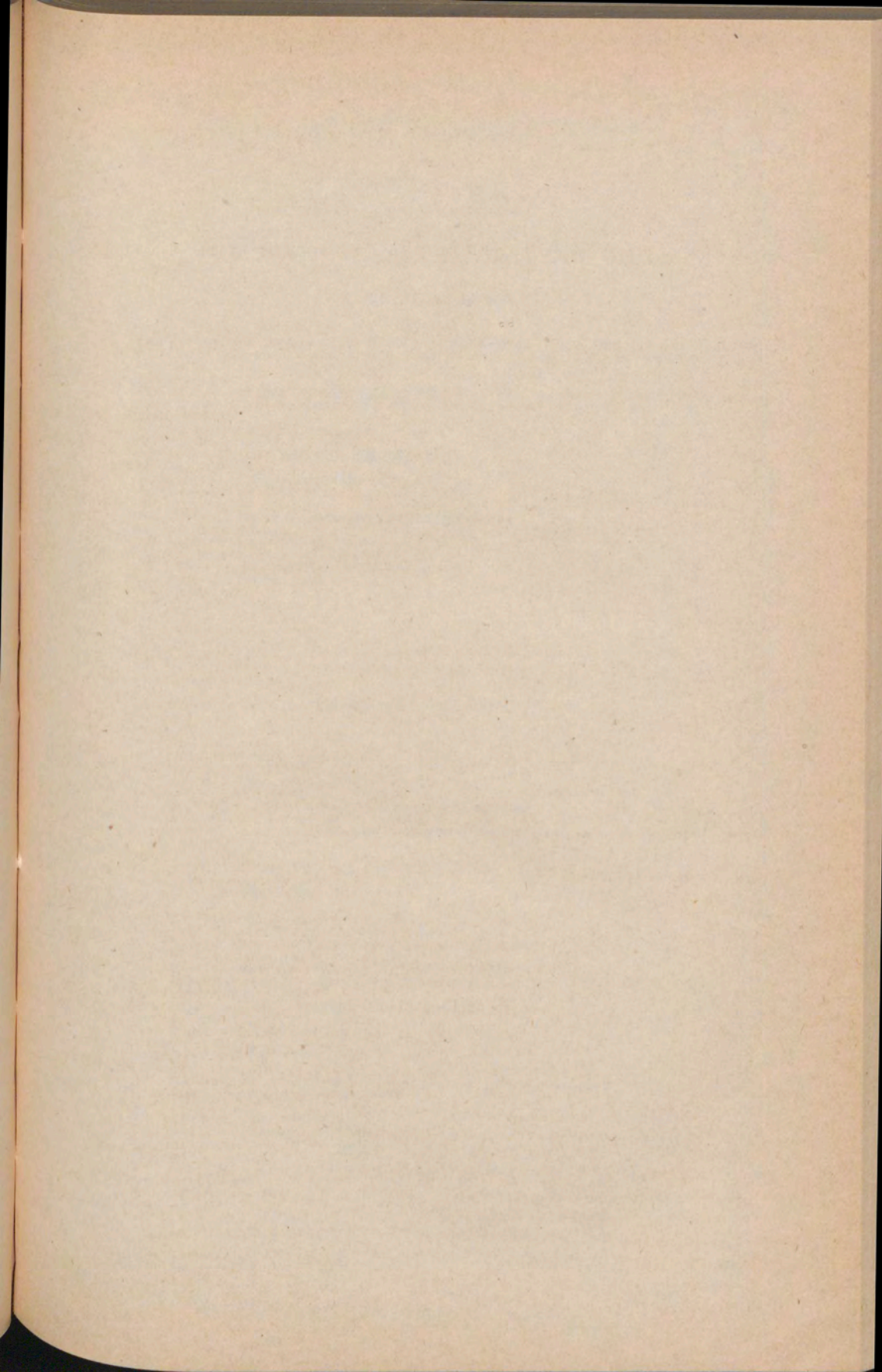

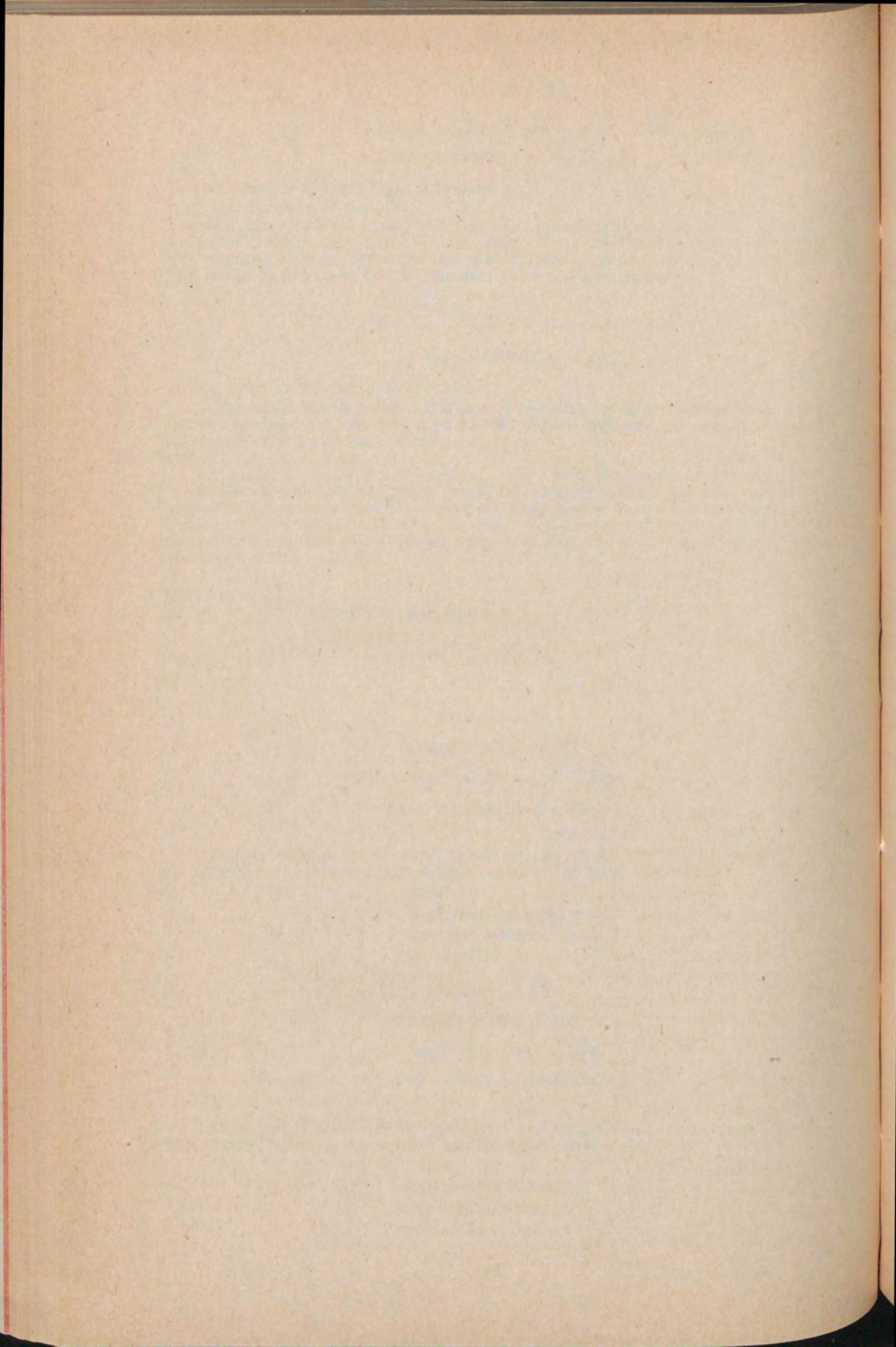

## Preface.

The first publications of Ohio were the Laws of the Governors and Judges, adopted under the Territorial Government.

From the organization of the State in 1803 until 1835, the State publications consisted of the Laws, the Senate Journal, and the House Journal. In the Journals appeared the reports of the State officers, together with the reports of the investigating committees.

In 1835, the regular reports of the State officers and Institutions began to be published separately from the Journals. All the reports of each year were bound together in a series first known as the Legislative Documents, but now called the Executive Documents. All special reports were published either in the Journals, in the Appendices to the Journals, or in separate form.

Since 1854, the Agricultural Reports have been left out of the Executive Documents; some others are now regularly omitted, while others appear at irregular intervals.

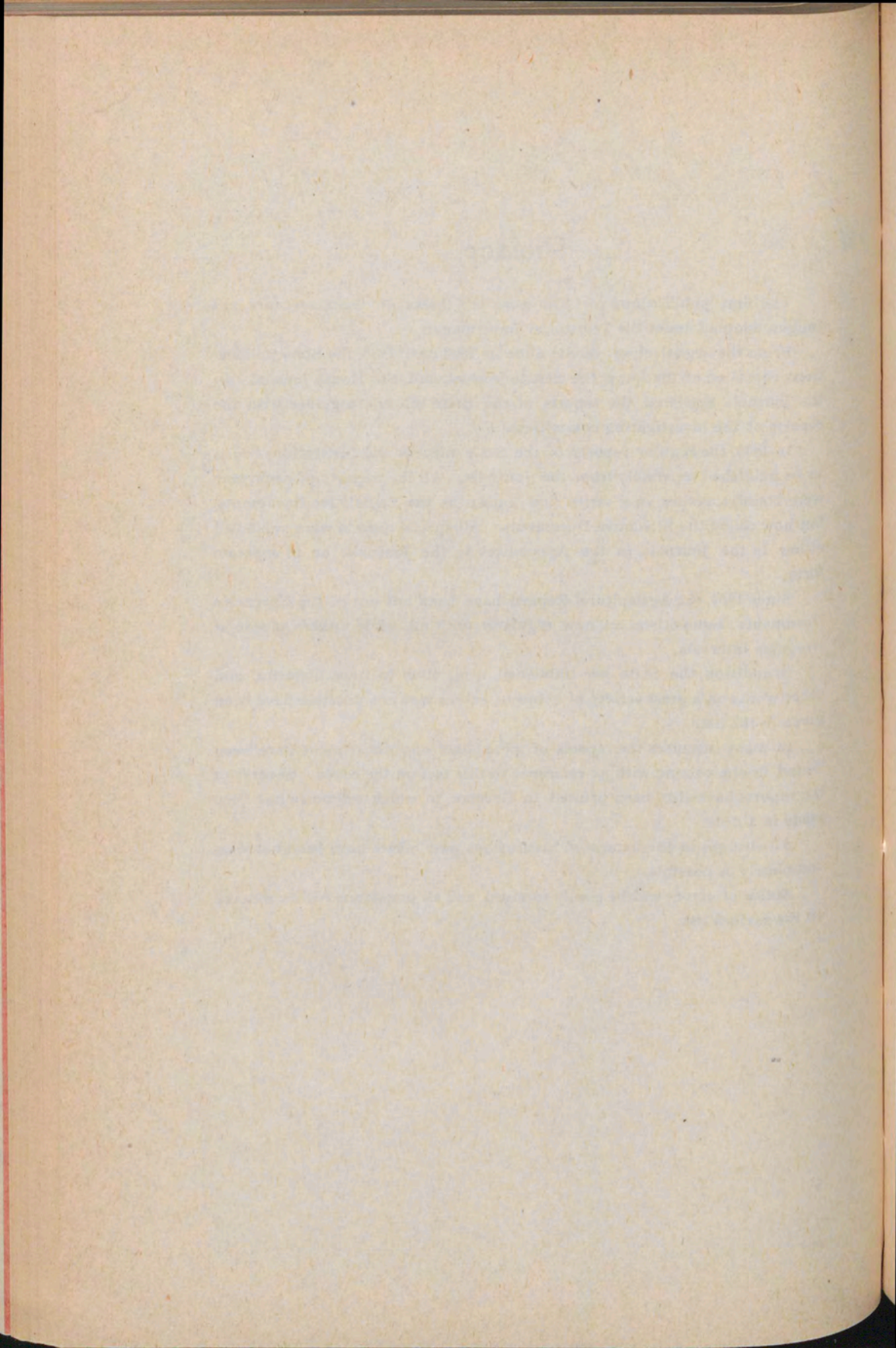
In addition the State has published, from time to time, historical and other works on a great variety of subjects, and as many as possible have been given in the list.

In many instances the reports of more than one department have been bound in one volume with no reference to this fact on the cover. Several of the reports have also been printed in German, to which reference has been made in a note.

All changes in the names of Institutions and offices have been noted as completely as possible.

Notice of errors will be gladly received, and all omissions will be entered on the revised list.

The first Fair Bulletin was made in 1850. All the Fair Bulletins are included in the annual Agricultural Reports, and all have been printed separately since 1882.

## FAIR PREMIUM LIST.

The first Premium List was made in 1850, but this was printed in the annual Agricultural Report for 1849. The Premium List was included in the annual Agricultural Report up to, and including 1877.

## FARMERS' INSTITUTE BULLETIN.

The date of the First Institute Bulletin was 1881-1882. They have only been included in the annual Agricultural Report since the passage of the institute law in 1890. They have all been printed separately.

## FARMERS' INSTITUTE REPORT.

The date of the first report was 1880-81. The reports are all in the annual Agricultural Reports, and have only been printed separately since 1890-91.

## FERTILIZER REPORT.

The date of the first Fertilizer Report was 1881. They are included in the annual Agricultural Report from 1881-1884. They have all been printed separately and annually.

## CROP REPORTS.

The date of the first Crop Report was 1880. Certain crop statistics have always been given in the annual Agricultural Report. The Crop Reports have always been printed separately, and issued monthly.

## WEATHER AND CROP REPORTS.

The date of the first issue was 1893. They are not included in the annual Agricultural Reports but the Weather Bureau made an annual report, which was included in the Annual Agricultural Report for 1893, 94, and 95. They have all been printed separately and every month. The report for '93 is in Executive Documents, 1893, Part 2.
